This Sunday, the Church celebrates the feast of Christ the King. This feast was instituted in 1926 to combat the secularism/materialism that was overtaking the world after World War 1. To combat the influence of Nazism, Communism and other social uprisings of the time, the Church sought to remind the faithful that Jesus Christ has supreme power over all by His life, Death and Resurrection. Pope Paul VI revived the feast, placing it on the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year as a bridge between the end of the Liturgical Year and the beginning of the Advent Season which prepares us for the second coming of Christ. In these turbulent times, this feast is a great reminder to us that all power in our world is given only through God, as Jesus said to Pilate "...You would have no power over me if it had not been not given to you from above..." John 19:11. Sunday's Gospel reminds us that true power consists in service to others and that is the example Jesus gave us.
