It is time to kick off the **2020 CGH Summer Scholars Program**. The program will provide local high school students aspiring to become physicians with an opportunity to explore various areas of the health care field and to develop mentoring relationships with professionals at CGH Medical Center.

The program is intended for highly motivated students who have a good academic record and a sincere interest in becoming a physician. Graduating high school seniors may apply. Students accepted into the program will work 4-5 hours per day Monday through Friday for a period of six weeks. During that time they will rotate through areas of medicine and surgery, receive lectures on health care career paths, and complete one project under the guidance of a mentor. Each CGH Summer Scholar will receive a \$1,500 scholarship to support his/her college education. CGH SUMMER SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Program Description

The purpose of the **CGH Summer Scholars Program** is to provide local high school students who aspire to be physicians with an opportunity to explore the health care field. The opportunity consists of working one-on-one with CGH doctors, attending lectures about careers in the health care field and completing one research project relevant to public health.

Program Goals

- 1. To educate participants about opportunities in health care as potential careers.
- 2. To engage the participants in the daily work of health care professionals.
- 3. To inspire participants to pursue a career in the field of health care.

Students Eligible

Graduating High school seniors

Time Commitment

The program will start at the end of the academic school year and run for 6 weeks.

Schedule

The daily schedule will be 8:00am to noon. Scholars will rotate through an area of medicine each week (Emergency Department including EMS, family medicine/internal medicine, surgery, and subspecialty exposure in both surgery and medicine). During each rotation the scholars will learn about that area of medicine by shadowing a staff doctor. Twice per week scholars will attend a lecture from 12:30 to 1:30pm. The lectures will be relevant to their rotations and potential careers in health care.

At the beginning of the program, scholars will choose one area of particular interest to them and will be assigned a mentor in that area. Working with the mentor, the scholar will determine a topic relevant to public health and research the topic for presentation at the end of the program. For example, if a scholar chooses orthopedics as the area of interest, then the research topic might be osteoporosis and how it affects the surrounding community.
