Newman Central Catholic High School offers scholarships through the funding of its benefactors. The benefactors of Newman are greatly appreciated as they assist with the funding of students tuition and overall expenses of the school. Prior to submission of your scholarship essay, you must have registered for next school year. Scholarship applications not meeting these criteria will not be considered. All papers must be submitted by April 1st, 2019.

Scholarship applicants need to email a one-page essay answering questions on the following two subjects ***unless otherwise stated in the Scholarships listed below***; 1. ***Why receiving a Catholic education is important to you?*** 2. ***How will you benefit from this scholarship?***

Please include the following information in the introductory paragraph of your essay: Name, Address, Present Grade, Present School, Father and Mother Name along with their occupation, list any siblings, and anyone else that lives in your household. Also include, a list of activities you participate in, in and outside of school. Criteria for each scholarship may differ. Please read the criteria carefully, as some scholarships require additional information and/or require an extra essay.

NEW!!! - The scholarship essay deadline is April 1st, 2019 at 3:00 PM. EVERY scholarship for which you are applying MUST be submitted in a .pdf format and sent to the E-MAIL listed on the scholarship. Scholarships must be submitted to the proper scholarship e-mail and titled in the following manner or it will not be accepted: ***last name, first name and scholarship name***
Example: Smith, John - Bittorf.pdf.
