

Dear Family and Friends of Newman Central Catholic High School,

Thank you to all who donated to Newman during the 2018-2019 school year. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. The donated funds have been applied to benefit all of our students and faculty in many ways including: 1. Assistance to students with tuition needs, 2. Technology advancements as we move to one-to-one, 3. New classroom doors to meet safety codes and 4. Security cameras throughout and around the building. We continue to improve our safe environment and to provide a quality educational experience for our students here at Newman.

Newman has experienced a decline in enrollment which is evident among Catholic High Schools across the state of Illinois. There are many variables that come into play with the enrollment issue. Tuition is one of those variables. Newman has the lowest tuition out of all the high schools in the Rockford Diocese. We try to keep it affordable as we feel a Catholic education is vital to the development of our youth. Our current enrollment is 208 down from 222 students last year. Tuition at Newman Central Catholic High School is \$4,500. This school year we had 31 students receive tuition assistance which equaled \$54,500 and 86 students who benefited from \$121,095 in scholarships. During this time of our Annual Appeal we hope that you, our families and alumni, will continue to support our efforts with your prayerful contribution.




Volleyball




